- **Vendor Representative**

The successful vendor agrees to send a personal representative with binding authority for the company to the Brownsville Public Utilities Board upon request to make adjustments and/or assist with coordination of all transactions as needed.

- **Determining Factors for Award**

1. Bidders net price on bid items

6. Safety record will be considered when determining the responsibility of the bidder

- **Contract with Vendor/Entity Indebted to BPUB**

It is a policy of the BPUB to refuse to enter into a contract or other transaction with an individual, sole proprietorship, joint venture, Limited Liability Company or other entity indebted to BPUB.

- **Vendor ACH (Direct Deposit) Services**

BPUB has implemented a payment service for vendors by depositing the payment directly to the vendor's bank account. Successful vendor(s) will be required to receive payments directly through Automated Clearing House (ACH) in lieu of a paper check. **The awarded vendor must agree to receive payments via ACH (Direct Deposit).**

- **Tax Identification Number (TIN)**

In accordance with IRS Publication 1220, aW9 form, or a W8 form in cases of a foreign vendor, will be required of all vendors doing business with the Brownsville PUB. If a W9 or W8 form is not made available to Brownsville PUB, the first payment will be subject to income tax withholding at a rate of 28% or 30% depending on the U.S. status and the source of income as

per IRS Publication 1220. **The W9 or W8 form must be included with bid response.** Attached are sample forms.

- **Taxes**

The Brownsville Public Utilities Board is exempt from Federal Excise Tax, State Tax and local Taxes. Do not include tax in the bid. If it is determined that tax was included in the bid it will not be included in the tabulation or any awards. Tax exemption certificates will be furnished upon request.

- **Signing of Bid**

Failure to sign bid will disqualify it. Person signing bid should show title or authority to bind their firm to a contract.

- **EEOC Guidelines**

During the performance of this contract, the contractor agrees not to discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, national origin, age, religion, gender, marital or veteran status, or physically challenging condition.

- **As Needed Basis (Reserved)**

Quantities are to be released on an “as needed” basis and be billed as such. However, successful vendor must keep in stock one (1) release, if requested in bid, for immediate shipment to the BPUB. Brownsville PUB will not accept the full quantity at one time as specified on Cost Sheet.

- **Contract and Purchase Order**

The poles shall be delivered FOB Water Port Electrical Substation, 3160 North Illinois Avenue, Brownsville, Texas 78521. A contract for the poles will be placed into effect by means of a purchase order issued by the Brownsville Public Utilities Board after tabulation and final approval by the Board.

- **Brownsville Public Utilities Board Rights**

1. If only one or no bid is received by "submission date", the BPUB has the right to reject, re-bid, accept and/or extend the bid by up to an additional two (2) weeks from original submission date.
2. The right to reject any/or all bids and to make award as they may appear to be advantageous to the Brownsville Public Utilities Board.
3. The right to hold bid for 90 days from submission date without action, and to waive all formalities in bid.
4. The right to extend the total bid beyond the original 90 days period prior to an award, if agreed upon in writing by all parties (BPUB and vendor/contractor) and if bidder/vendor holds original bid prices firm.

5. The right to terminate for cause or convenience all or any part of the unfinished portion of the Project resulting from this solicitation within Thirty (30) calendar days written notice; for cause: upon default by the vendor/contractor, for delay or non-performance by the vendor/contractor; or if it is deemed in the best interest of the BPUB for BPUB's convenience.
6. The right to increase or decrease quantities. In bid, stipulate whether an increase or decrease in quantities will affect bid price
7. The Brownsville PUB has the right to refuse to enter into a contract or other transaction with any individual or entity indebted to the municipality as per Local Government Code 252.0436.

- **Corrections**

Any interpretation, correction, or change to the invitation to bid will be made by ADDENDUM. Changes or corrections will be issued by the Brownsville PUB Purchasing Department. **Addenda will be emailed to all who have returned the Bid Acknowledgment form.** Addenda will be issued as expeditiously as possible. It is the responsibility of the vendors to determine whether all addenda have been received. It will be the responsibility of all respondents to contact the Brownsville PUB prior to submitting a response to the invitation to bid to ascertain if any addenda have been issued, and to obtain any all addenda, execute them, and return addenda with the response to the invitation to bid. Addenda may be posted on the Brownsville PUB's website.

Specifications for Spun Cast Prestressed Concrete Poles

1. Scope:

- 1.1. The following specifications cover the design and manufacturer of 10-90' corner guyed dead-end spun cast prestressed concrete poles.

2. General Requirements

2.1. Manufacturer

The Manufacturer must be an established company which has produced poles of a similar type and height within the last five years, built similar structures of like quantity per project, has proven quality and delivery performance, or has been pre-qualified by the BPUB prior to bidding. All structural design calculations must be prepared by an Engineer experienced in prestressed concrete design, working under the direction of a Registered Professional Engineer.

2.2 Specifications

Any specification, code or document referred to in this specification is to be considered as part of this specification. In the event of conflict between this specification and referenced documents, the requirements of this specification shall take precedence. The latest revision of the following specifications, standards and codes apply:

2.2.1. Prestressed Concrete Institute "Guide Specification for Design of Prestressed Concrete Poles" (JR 257) and "Guide for Design of Prestressed Concrete Poles" (JR 275), latest editions.

2.2.2. Prestressed Concrete Institute "Manual for Quality Control for Plants and Production of Prestressed Concrete Products" (MNL-116).

2.2.3. American Society of Civil Engineers "Guide for the Design and Use of Concrete Poles".

2.2.4. National Electric Safety Code" (NESC), ANSI C-2, published by the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers, Inc., latest edition.

2.2.5. American Society for Testing and Materials (ASTM) as pertaining to the steel, concrete and admixtures used in pole fabrication:

2.2.5.1 ASTM C150 Portland Cement

2.2.5.2 ASTM C33 Aggregate

2.2.5.3 ASTM C494 Admixtures

2.2.5.4 ASTM A421 Prestressing Wire

2.2.5.5 ASTM A416 Prestressing Strand

- 2.2.5.6 ASTM A615 Reinforcing Bars
- 2.2.5.7 ASTM A82 Spiral Wire Reinforcing
- 2.2.5.8 ASTM C618 Flyash

2.2.6 American Concrete Institute Standard "Building Code Requirements for Reinforced Concrete" (ACI 318 - Latest Edition) also applies where applicable (ie: ACI concrete cover required over steel reinforcement applies to static cast field placed concrete rather than spun cast concrete produced in controlled environments).

3. Physical Characteristics

3.1. Shape and Size

All poles shall be circular in cross section, centrifugally spun, and shall have a uniform outside taper not greater than 0.216 inch per foot. Unless shown otherwise on the drawings or load tables, all structures shall have a minimum of a two and one half (2 1/2) inch wall thickness at the pole tip. Poles are assumed to be direct embedded to a depth of 10% of overall length plus two (2) feet, unless otherwise stated.

3.2. Void and End Treatment

The pole shall contain a void designed to be consistent with the strength requirements and weight reduction. Both the top and bottom ends of the pole shall be plugged with an epoxy-grout or non-shrink dry-packed concrete mix. The plug shall be a minimum of twelve (12) inches thick except that the tip plug need not exceed the distance to the first through-hole or six (6) inches, whichever is the least distance. The prestressed steel strands at both ends of the pole shall be burned back at least 1 inch into the concrete, and the slag and carbon shall be cleaned off prior to the plugging of the resulting hole with an epoxy-grout mix. A metal pole cap, suitably fastened to prevent removal, may be used at the pole tip in lieu of plugging the void and burning the strand. If a pole tip cap is used, the strand shall be cut flush with the tip surface and the ends cleaned and coated with an epoxy. The bottom pole plug will have a two (2") inch diameter hole, through the entire thickness of the plug, to allow ground water to escape from the interior void of the pole.

3.3. Finish

The pole shall have a smooth, uniform natural concrete finish with no cracks. Sharp edges shall be tooled to smooth. The outside surface along the length of the structure shall be troweled until all projections, depressions and irregularities have been removed and the entire surface has a smooth texture. All small cavities caused by air bubbles, honeycomb, or other small voids shall be cleaned, saturated with water and then carefully pointed with mortar. A small cavity is defined as one not larger than one-half inch (1/2") in diameter nor deeper than one-quarter inch (1/4"). Large cavities not exceeding two (2) inches long shall be repaired by opening the cavity sides on a 1 to 1 slope with a mechanical grinder, cleaning thoroughly, and patching with an epoxy-grout mix in accordance with the product manufacturer's specifications. Poles damaged with cavities larger than the foregoing shall be reviewed by the Manufacturer's engineer for

disposition, and if deemed repairable with no reduction in required strength or durability will notify the Purchaser for further instructions. The manufacturer shall take necessary measures to prevent mold seam leaks that may occur during the spinning process. If excessive seam leaks are detected, the pole will be further inspected to ascertain whether sufficient quantity of cement paste has escaped to cause honeycombing or other damage to the wall. Poles exhibiting excessive signs of honeycombing shall be rejected.

3.4. Holes

The manufacturer shall drill or cast holes in the pole as specified on the drawings. All cast-in through holes shall contain a PVC sleeve extending through the full diameter of the pole. The diameter of all holes and the tolerances between holes shall be in accordance with the latest revision of the "Guide Specification for Design of Prestressed Concrete Poles".

3.5. Grounding

The Manufacturer shall provide one-half inch (1/2") non-corrosive inserts cast into the pole, spaced at a distance of five feet (5'), beginning at the pole butt and continuing to the top of the pole. A brass insert (tank ground) shall be cast in at a point six inches (6") from the pole top and at a point near the ground line; and connected internally to the steel reinforcing by a #6 copper wire. Each insert shall be equipped with a one-half inch (1/2") bolt and galvanized wire clip, for the attachment of the Purchaser's groundwire.

3.6. Marking

All poles shall have cast in, on one face, a brass identification plate containing the manufacturer's name, the name of the Purchaser, date of manufacture, pole length, actual scaled weight, a unique fabrication or serial number, and groundline moment for strength identification. The groundline moment for each pole will be based on its actual, ultimate groundline moment value, designed by the Manufacturer. The name plate should be approximately five (5') feet above the groundline.

3.7. Concrete Cover

The vertical or prestressing steel shall have a cover of concrete to the outside face or to the inside void not smaller than one inch (1"). The minimum concrete cover on spirals shall not be less than three-quarters of an inch (3/4").

4. Strength Requirements

Poles design shall be prepared from the wire data and configuration drawings attached. Poles must be designed to withstand all the ultimate loads including the secondary moments applied to the structure and appurtenances (fixtures, wires, etc.) in a 100 mph wind pressure. All cables to be loaded to 50% of their ultimate strengths. The corner dead-end poles must be designed to be guyed in two directions. The bisector angled poles must be designed to be guyed in one direction. A three-dimensional stiffness analysis must be made in order to account for the combined effects of all the loads applied.

5. Materials

5.1 Concrete

5.1.1. The wet concrete mix used shall contain no more than 0.40 pounds per cubic yard (lbs/cy) of total chloride ions, and shall have a maximum water cement ratio of 0.40 by weight.

5.1.2. Concrete used shall have a static cylinder compressive strength at 28 days not less than 12,000 psi (known as f'c). The cement, water, aggregates and admixtures used shall conform to the applicable ASTM standards for those materials and be of such quality as to prevent pyrite staining or damage due to sulfates or adverse aggregate alkali reaction

5.1.3. All concrete material shall conform to ACI 318. The chemical properties of all concrete materials shall be such that neither pyrite staining nor efflorescence due to sulfates and/or chlorides will occur.

5.1.4. Portland Cement shall conform to ASTM C150.

5.1.5. Ready-mix concrete shall conform to ASTM C94.

5.1.6. Aggregates shall conform to ASTM C33 or C330. Course aggregate shall be crushed stone; clean, tough and well graded. The maximum size shall be three-fourth (3/4) inch or three-fourth (3/4) of the clear spacing between the reinforcing steel or of the clear spacing between the reinforcing steel and the surface of the pole. The resistance to abrasion shall not exceed a percentage of wear of 40% per ASTM C131. Fine aggregate shall be natural sand consisting of clean, strong, hard, durable, uncoated and well-graded particles.

5.1.7. Water used in mixing concrete shall be free of oils, acids, alkalis, salts, organic matter or other substances in amounts that may be harmful to concrete or steel. Chemical admixtures shall conform to ASTM C494. Air entraining agents, if any, shall conform to ASTM C260 and the fly ash or other pozzolanic admixtures shall conform to ASTM C618.

5.2. Presressing Steel Tendons

5.2.1. The prestressing steel tendons shall be stress relieved 7 wire strand conforming to ASTM A-416 (latest edition) specification for uncoated seven-wire stress relieved strand for prestressed concrete, for both normal and low relaxation strand.

5.2.2. Welding of the prestressed steel is not allowed.

5.3. Inserts

All inserts shall be manufactured of a non-corrosive material.

5.4. Spiral Wire

All poles shall contain spiral steel reinforcement throughout the entire pole length. The minimum diameter of the spiral wire shall be three-sixteenths inches (3/16") and conforming to ASTM A-82, latest revision. The spacing shall conform to the following:

5.4.1. For a distance of three feet from the tip and butt of the pole, spirals shall be spaced a maximum of 1¾ inches on center but no less than 1¼ inches.

5.4.2 If torsional loads are encountered, the spiral spacing shall be adjusted, if necessary, to provide sufficient reinforcing in accordance with Section 11.6 of ACI 318-95.

5.4.3. Closer spiral spacing may also be required in the region between three feet above groundline to the pole butt to adequately resist the increased shear encountered in developing the resisting soil pressure.

5.4.4. The maximum center to center spacing (pitch) throughout the remainder of the pole shall be such that the following condition is satisfied:
 $A_v \cdot F_v / s \geq 0.48$; where "A_v" is the area of one spiral leg in inches², "F_v" is the design yield stress of the grade of steel used in ksi (≤ 60 ksi) and "s" is the center to center spacing of the spirals in inches. In no case shall the spacing "s" exceed 4 inches.

6. Testing for Concrete Strength

The Manufacturer shall, at his expense, take at least eight representative cylinders of each day's pour and test as follows: one at release, two at seven days, two at 14 days, two at 28 days and one spare. A copy of the test reports shall be furnished to BPUB.

6.1. Strength Correlation Factor

The Manufacturer shall show a correlation factor obtained by documented test results between the value of the ultimate concrete strength (F'_c) used in the design of spun poles and the value of the static cast cylinders. If no correlation between static cast and spun concrete is furnished, then the maximum spun concrete design strength allowed shall not exceed the static cast cylinder test by more than 5%.

6.2. Minimum Shipping Strength

Poles may not be shipped until the static concrete strength test has achieved the 28-day value used in the design. An exception to this may be taken only with prior approval of the Purchaser, and only if the Manufacturer can produce statistical records showing that an earlier shipping date would still result in the design strength being achieved within the 28-day period.

7. Inspection & Quality Assurance

7.1 Inspection by BPUB

BPUB or its authorized representative shall have access to the work at all times for inspection wherever the poles are in preparation or progress. The Manufacturer shall provide proper facilities for such access and inspection without additional cost to the buyer. All materials will be subject to "Job Site Inspection". To avoid delays and complications, the Purchaser will make every effort to inspect the poles upon delivery and notify the Manufacturer of any problems immediately. Material may be rejected at the time of the first inspection or at any time defects are found during the progress of the erection or installation. Inspection by the purchaser or waiving of inspection shall not relieve the Manufacturer from the responsibility for furnishing products that conform to the requirements of this specification.

7.2 Manufacturer's Quality Assurance Program

The manufacturer shall have an active in-plant Quality Assurance Program and perform daily checks and tests on the products made. The program shall cover the entire production process including the delivery of the product. A written record of these tests and inspections shall be made at the Manufacturer's plant facility for Purchaser's review. Each pole manufactured shall have a unique identification number which correlates to a specific quality control inspection traveler/report.

8. Manufacturing tolerances

8.1 Product Tolerances

Product tolerances shall be limited to the following:

8.1.1 Overall length: +3 inches / -2 inches.

8.1.2 Pole diameter: + / - ¼ (one-quarter) inch

8.1.3 Wall thickness: Allowable variation along the pole shall be not greater than +20%, with a maximum reduction of ¼ (one-quarter) inch provided that coverage over steel is maintained. Each pole shall be inspected for uniformity of inside appearance and wall thickness variation. If irregularities are encountered, then actual thickness measurements shall be taken by drilling pilot holes through the wall at ten foot intervals on the longitudinal axis of the pole. These holes shall be alternated 90 degrees at each interval.

8.1.4 End squareness: $\pm 1/2$ (one-half) inch per foot of pole diameter.

8.1.5 Pole Sweep: Sweep is the deviation of a pole from straightness. Sweep will be allowed in one plane and one direction only. A straight line joining the edges of the structure at both the top and the butt shall not be distant from the pole surface at any point more than $3/8$ inch for each 10 feet of length between these two points.

8.1.6 Weight: $\pm 10\%$ of computed value.

8.1.7 Location of longitudinal reinforcement at stressing header: $\pm 1/4$ (one-quarter) inch for individual strands, $\pm 1/8$ (one-eighth) inch for the centroid of a group of strands.

8.1.8 Spiral reinforcement: $\pm 25\%$ spacing variance, with total quantity per foot maintained.

8.1.9 Location of a group of bolt holes from pole tip: ± 2 inches.

8.1.10 Location of centerline between groups of bolt holes: ± 1 inch.

8.1.11 Location of bolt holes within a group of bolts: $\pm 1/8$ (one-eighth) inches.

8.1.12 Bolt hole diameter: $+1/8$ (one-eighth) inch of specified hole diameter or $+1/4$ (one-quarter) inch greater than actual bolt diameter.

8.1.13 Bolt hole alignment within a group of bolts: within $1/2$ (one-half) of the hole diameter from the bolt plane that is longitudinal to the pole's cross-sectional centerline in a group.

9. Pole Tests

9.1 Qualifying Tests

If the successful bidder to this specification has not previously supplied concrete poles of similar types, and is unable to submit sufficient strength data from previous structural tests, the bidder will be required to provide pole tests at his own expense. At least one test shall be performed. Samples shall be selected randomly by the buyer and be tested to failure.

9.2 Test Procedure

The test shall be performed in accordance with a method mutually approved by the BPUB or its representative and the manufacturer. The Manufacturer shall furnish a test report for each structure tested. The test report shall include the method of application of the loads, the positions of hairline and/or failure cracks, and the deflections under various loading conditions.

10. Handling

The pole design shall include allowances for loads due to handling, hauling, storage and erection without failure (including an appropriate impact factor) when handled according to the Manufacturer's recommendations and instructions and reasonably accepted construction practices. The following handling and erection loads are to be provided for:

10.1 The handling of poles in the horizontal position shall be accommodated by the provision of a two-point pickup, with the center of gravity and two lift points specified by the Manufacturer.

10.2 The necessary support criteria for hauling and horizontal storage of poles shall be specified by the Manufacturer.

10.3 Erection design shall provide for a single-point pickup located at a distance from the pole tip approximately one-third of the overall length, with the pole butt remaining on the ground.

11. Information Furnished by Manufacturer When Bidding

In addition to the price and delivery information, the manufacturer shall furnish the following:

11.1 General dimensions of the pole structures, including the over-all length, above ground height, tip and butt diameter, wall thickness, inside and outside taper, pole weight and groundline moment.

11.2 The 28-day concrete static compressive strength and correlation factor used for the basis of the pole designs (if not previously submitted and approved).

11.3 Any design exceptions taken in the preparation of the bid.

11.4 Manufacturer should be prepared to furnish unit prices (on a per five foot increment) in the event that a deeper embedment is required by the Purchaser.

11.5 Any other commercial terms, conditions or information the Manufacturer deems important to the Purchase's evaluation.

12. Information Furnished by Manufacturer upon Approval of Bid and Prior to Starting Production

12.1 Basic Approval Information

The Manufacturer shall furnish for approval by the Purchaser before manufacturing is begun, detailed fabrication drawings, which shall include:

12.1.1 Pole data showing length, tip and butt diameter, tip and butt thickness, design weight, center of gravity, taper, ultimate moment capacity, and embedment.

12.1.2 Concrete compressive strength (28-day) used for pole design.

12.1.3 Number and size of pretension tendons, as well as, prestress value.

12.1.4 Number, length and size of non-prestressed supplemental reinforcement.

12.1.5 Location, size and angular displacement of required mounting holes.

12.1.6 Contact points for handling, storage and installation.

12.2 The Manufacturer will also be required to provide the following information upon BPUB's request.

12.2.1 Groundline reactions, including required moment, shear and axial forces.

12.2.2 Deflection information for specific load cases.

12.2.3 Any unusual variances encountered during the design process (e.g., guy tensions exceeding the allowable for the sizes and quantity specified, etc.).

13. Shipping

13.1 Appurtenances are to be supplied by the Manufacturer of the concrete poles. Each shipment shall be accompanied by a list of all parts identifiable by structure type and number. Arms, bolts, and miscellaneous hardware shall be identified by the list for match up with the respective pole shaft. All parts required for any one structure shall be in one shipment, if possible.

13.2 The Manufacturer and BPUB (and/or the BPUB's representative) shall maintain communications in order to arrange and schedule delivery of materials and to obtain proper directions to the final destination. **BPUB Purchasing/Warehouse Department shall be notified** by the Manufacturer/Distributor **48 hours prior to shipment** that such shipment is to take place. BPUB Purchasing/Warehouse personnel to be contacted are Julio Perez at 956-983-6181 and Hugo E. Lopez at 956-983-6375. The notification of shipment shall give quantities, weights, name of carrier, and expected time of arrival.

13.3 Transportation and handling shall be performed with acceptable equipment and methods by qualified personnel. The Manufacturer shall exercise precaution to protect poles against damage in transit.

13.4 Handling instructions shall be included with the pole shipments.

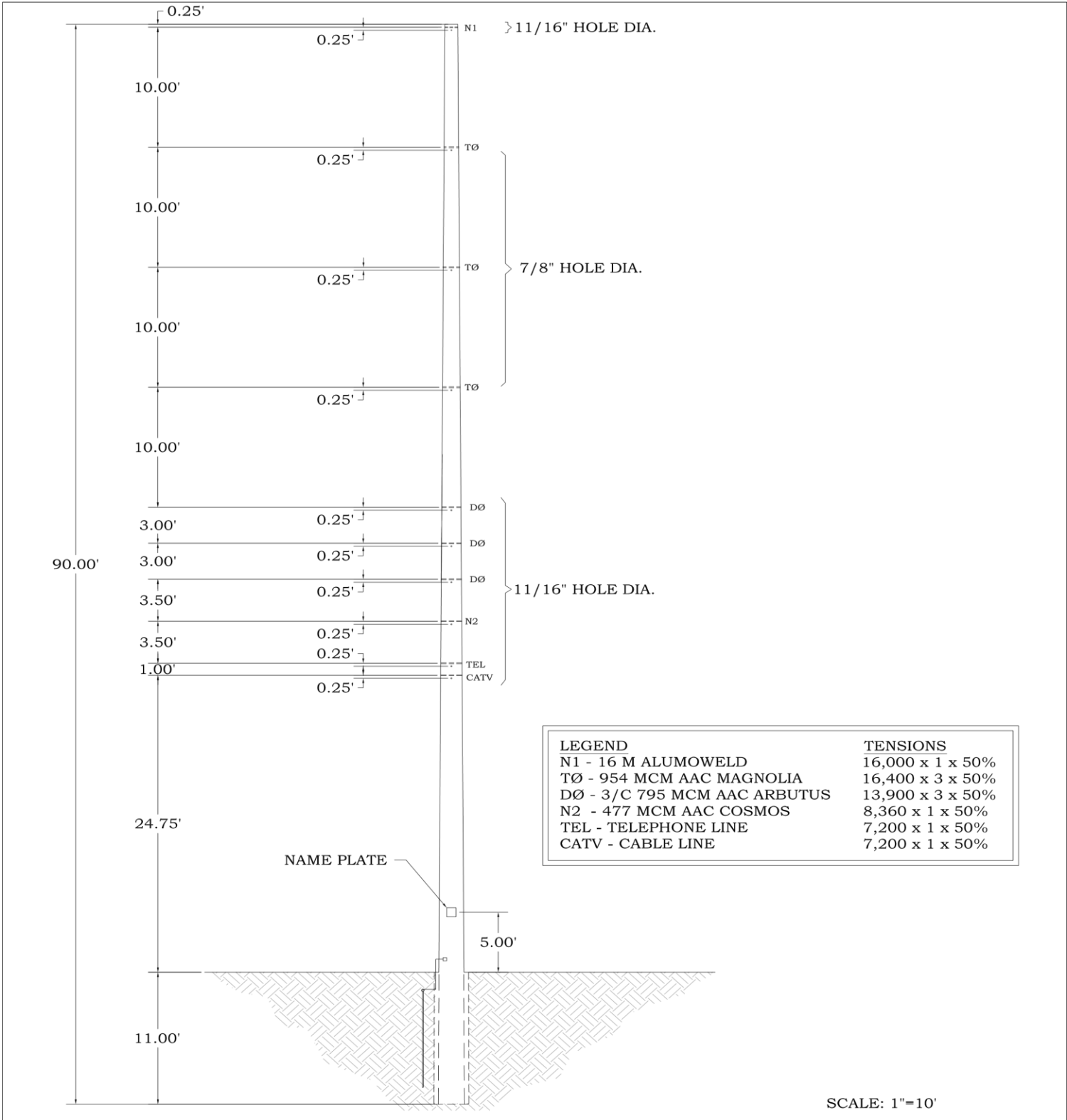
14. Delivery

All poles shall be delivered F.O.B. BPUB. Delivery costs and charges shall be included in the bid. All poles **must be delivered to 3160 N. Illinois Avenue, Brownsville, Texas 78521.** BPUB's Shipping & Receiving hours are Monday thru Friday, from 8:00 AM thru 4:00 PM. Manufacturer shall coordinate and cooperate with BPUB to ensure smooth and efficient delivery of poles. The Manufacturer will provide all labor, equipment, and materials for the unloading of poles at the designated site.

15. Bid Security and Materials Bond (Not Applicable)

Each bid shall be accompanied by a Certified or Cashier's check payable to the order of the Public Utilities Board of the City of Brownsville, Texas, for a sum not less than five (5%) percent of the total amount bid. In lieu of a check, a bid bond may be submitted in an amount not less than five (5%) percent of the total amount bid with a Corporate Surety licensed to do business in the State of Texas, conditioned that the BIDDER will pay the Brownsville PUB, as mutually agreed to liquidated damages, and not as a penalty, the amount specified in the bond unless he enters into a contract in accordance with his bid. **No bid will be considered if the Bid Security is not submitted.** Bidder is required to execute a contract and furnish a satisfactory Materials Bond and Certificate of Insurance within 10 days from the date of the Notice of Award. If the successful bidder fails to execute the contract and to furnish a satisfactory Materials Bond and Insurance Certificates within 10 days from the date on which they are notified that their bid has been accepted, the amount of the check or bid bond shall be forfeited to the Brownsville PUB as mutually agreed to liquidated damages, and not as a penalty.

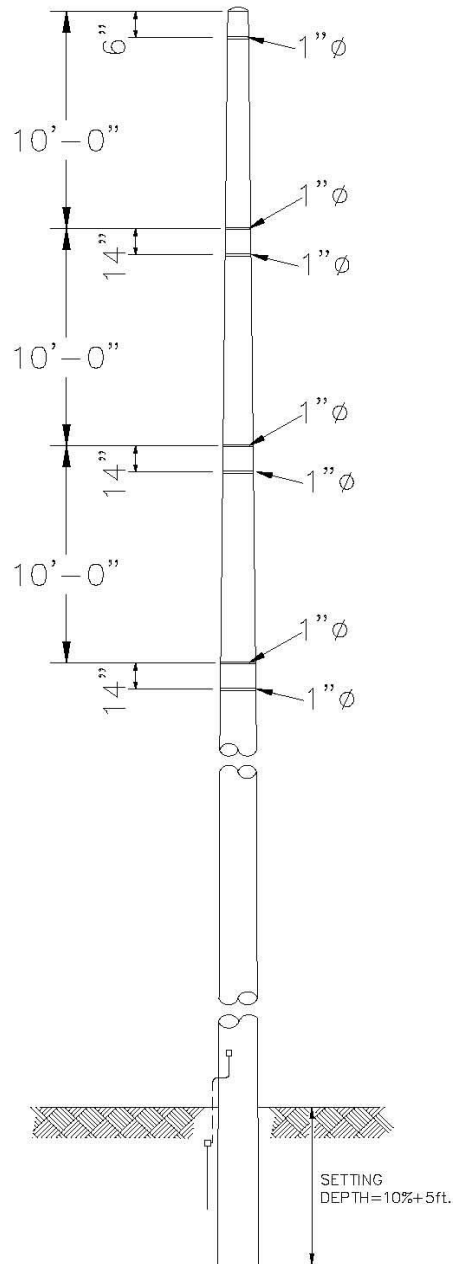

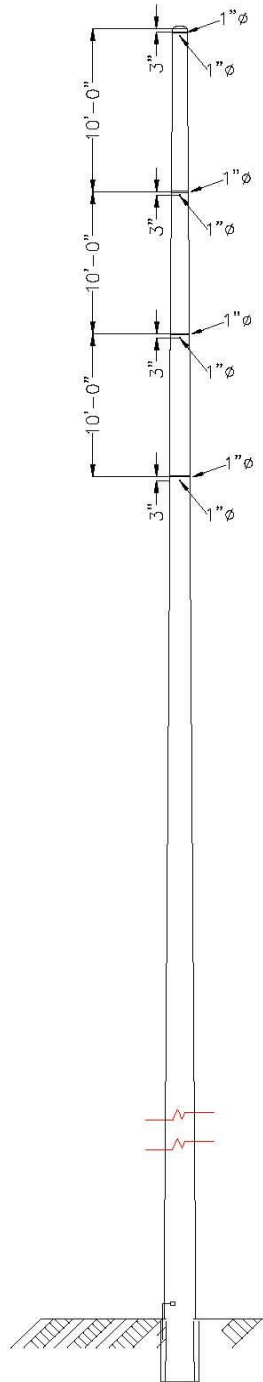

The commission also adopted new rules as part of Chapter 46 of the Texas Administrative Code on November 30, 2015.

On January 1, 2016, TEC made a new filing application available on their website for business entities to use to both create and file Form 1295. Business entities will enter the required information on Form 1295 within the application and print a copy of the completed form, which will include a certification of filing with a unique certification number. An authorized agent of the business entity will need to sign the printed copy of the form and have the form notarized. The completed Form 1295 with the certification of filing must be included with the signed contract to the governmental body or state agency in order for the governmental body to execute the contract.

Brownsville PUB will then notify the commission, using TEC's filing application, of the receipt of the filed Form 1295 with the certification of filing not later than the 30th day after the date the contract binds all parties to the contract.

TEC will then post the business entity's completed Form 1295 to its website within seven (7) business days after receiving notice from Brownsville PUB acknowledging that it was received.
